The Elkader Opera House has an induction loop system thanks to an upgrade of the sound equipment by the Opera House Players. 

# Director's Notes

A more expensive option to the new 1953 craze of recording your own singing voice on vinyl, Elvis walked into the Sun Record Company in Memphis hoping that the rumors of being discovered there were true. Asked by the secretary "Well, who do you sound like?" He responded with, "Ma'am. I don't sound like nobody." The assessment of that demo performance was, "Good ballad singer. Hold." At his first public performance, Elvis was extremely nervous causing his leg to shake. A born showman, he decided to exaggerate the movement to make it look intentional causing a huge audience response. Thinking they hated him and were booing him offstage, he was assured that was not the case.

Presley has become an indelible part of popular culture and has influenced generations of people. I so enjoyed this well-written script by Nancy Frick (who, though initially not interested in theatre, was welcomed by a hometown group and after many years of working backstage as a crew member, producer and director, finally tried her hand at playwriting), I realized how much I really did love Elvis. In this "little love song" of a show, I wanted to be faithful and pay tribute to the things that defined him. BIll Belew, inspired by a floor tile, created The Conquistador black jumpsuit (often worn in his Las Vegas shows) designed to appease Elvis' distaste for tuxedos while lending a greater ease of movement after Presley ripped his pants during a performance. Electing not to go "with one particular motif," Graceland's original interior designer, George Golden (winning the job because he befriended Elvis' dad and never badgered mom to make any decisions), was once described as "a man who created fine examples of incongruous opulence of a late fifties' lush life." Naturally, it became an inspiration in my choices for set and prop design.

John Lennon once commented, "Before Elvis, there was nothing." For me, the story of Elvis is one of many that shows how the arts matter. Music, theatre, dance, writing, painting - all are not optional but absolutely essential in finding and celebrating the joys of our life. Thank you for supporting the arts by seeing the results of the many diverse talents of countless dedicated, hard-working community members. My hope is that if you do not find your own inner creative force, you will gladly embrace it when it finds you.
